

GDP growth (annual %)




GDP growth has been recovering from the pandemic reaching 8.5% in 2021 and is expected to stabilize at 4% in 2022.

The Albanian economy is liberalized and mainly focused on tourism and natural resources (chromium, oil and other minerals). It is also integrated into global capital flows, and shows strong economic performance. The euro zone is the destination of nearly 80% of its exports and the country's largest investor

Road

Albania has about 20,000 km of roads, special attention is paid to the connection with Macedonia, Kosovo, Montenegro and Greece.



Airport

Mother Teresa International Airport is the main airport in the country. It was built in 1957 with a track with a length of 2,750 meters and a width of 45 m.



Railway

677 km of rail system.

Albania is connected to a railway network with Montenegro for the transport of goods.



Energy & Telecom

The telecommunications sector in Albania is growing and it is regulated by the law on electronic communications.

Fishing: The marine fish fauna includes several demersal species, small and large pelagics, crustaceans and molluscs

Mines: Albania has 48 identified mines listed. The most commonly listed raw materials in Albanian mines are chromium, nickel and copper. Elbasan, Kukes and Lezhe are the richest in mines.

With 110 million tons of nickel, Albania is among the largest producers in the world. Albania ranks fourth in the world in quantity and first in quality and density for chromium.

Renewable energies: very low-carbon electricity production thanks to its hydraulic park, which accounts for 95% of installed electricity capacity.

Tourism: great potential due to its sea of turquoise and translucent waters, national parks, towns listed as UNESCO World Heritage sites and pretty mountains.











Main exported products by Albania in 2021 - MUSD




Main customers of Albania in 2020











OIC shares in Albanian exports of goods

Top 10 Suppliers, OIC Members in 2020




