## Concept Note

### Regional Workshop on the State of Play of The WTO Negotiations for the Benefit of OIC Countries



#### Context:

Given the impasse in the Doha Round, some WTO members have launched initiatives since the 11<sup>th</sup> WTO Ministerial Conference (MC11), held in Buenos Aires (Argentina) in 2017, with a view to make progress in discussions on vital areas of great importance for development.

Among the new topics under negotiation, we have the following: E-commerce; investment facilitation for development; Micros, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSME); Internal Regulation in the field of Services; and Trade and Environment.

In the same vein, discussions are currently underway in the WTO regarding:

- Fisheries subsidies;
- Agriculture;
- Services;
- Special and differential treatment;

The above-mentioned topics will be on the agenda of the 12<sup>th</sup> Ministerial Conference (CM12), scheduled from 30<sup>th</sup> November to 3<sup>rd</sup> December 2021 in Geneva.

In preparation of this important meeting, OIC countries will be called upon to prepare positions involving all stakeholders at the national level in order to better contribute to the discussions of these issues and take better advantage of the opportunities offered through the WTO negotiations.

In addition, these topics are also of great importance for the development of trade, investment, and regional integration within OIC space, to gain competitive advantage in global value chains. This requires a good understanding of the opportunities and the challenges that arise from them, based on the experiences of the OIC countries.

In this regard, ICDT, IsDB and WTO are organizing a regional workshop on the state of play of the WTO negotiations for the benefit of OIC Countries.

#### Objectives:

The main objective of this workshop is to support the OIC countries in the ongoing discussions at the WTO, in preparation of the 12<sup>th</sup> Ministerial Conference (CM12). The specific objectives are:

- Information updating;
- Exchange of experiences and expertise;
- Facilitate the contribution of OIC countries to ongoing discussions.

### **Expected results:**

- Sensitizing OIC countries to WTO issues,
- Better understanding of the opportunities and challenges of ongoing discussions on the above-mentioned topics,
- Recommendations / proposals for better coordination between OIC countries within WTO.

### **Methodology:**

The workshop will take place virtually over 3 days. The sessions will revolve around the aforementioned specific topics under discussion at the WTO, in the form of presentations which will be delivered by experts from the WTO and followed by question-and-answer sessions. It is also planned an experience exchange session, moderated by experts from some Member States who will share their experiences on these topics.

This workshop will result in recommendations that will be presented in future consultation meetings of the OIC countries and those of the relevant economic bodies of the OIC.

### **Participants:**

This workshop will target participants from OIC countries:

- Ministries in charge of trade,
- Members of national committees of trade negotiations,
- Permanent missions of OIC countries accredited to the WTO,
- Sub-regional organizations of the OIC zone,
- Private sector organizations.

### **Language:**

The workshop will be held in English and French. Simultaneous interpretation in Arabic, English and French will be provided.

### **Date and venue of the workshop:**

The workshop will be held virtually from June 21<sup>st</sup> to 23<sup>rd</sup> June 2021, from 10am to 1pm, Greenwich +1 (GMT + 1), on a videoconferencing platform.
